Subject: The Revenue Department is pleased, taxpayers like the submission of forms

online. The number of online submissions increases 17%

Dr. Satit Rungkasiri, Director General of the Revenue Department, revealed that "currently the number of taxpayers who are interested in submitting tax forms online have increased a total of 17% for every type of tax, or a total increase of 1,284,158 forms which were submitted through the internet. This can be divided into an increase of 599,166 forms for personal income tax, 241,783 forms for juristic person income tax, 434,935 for value added tax and 8,274 for specific business tax, representing an increase in the amount of tax collected through the internet of 61% for every type of tax. This increased interest is a result of the Revenue Department extending the period for form submission for 8 days for taxpayers who choose to submit forms through the internet, the prompt return of tax within 15 days and allowing for tax to be paid via credit cards, providing the taxpayers with more cash flow. The Revenue Department is also preparing other measures, to be implemented in the near future, to encourage more taxpayers to submit forms through the internet".
