Subject	:	The Revenue Department advises taxpayers on e-Tax Invoice

Today (18th December 2012) the Revenue Department, the Thai Listed Companies Association, together with The Securities and Exchange Commission, held a seminar on "Guidelines for the use of electronic tax invoice (e-Tax Invoice) to strengthen the capacity of the organization" at conference room, the Revenue Department Building. **Dr.Satit Rungkasiri, Director General of the Revenue Department** gave an opening speech **Ms. Prowmatr Hantra, Principal Advisor on Information and Communication Technology** giving a presentation to all the participants of more than 200 private companies.

Dr. Satit Rungkasiri, Director General of the Revenue Department, stated that "The Revenue Department encourages the VAT entrepreneurs to e-Tax Invoice instead of paper Tax Invoice according to the e-Government policy, because the entrepreneur can issue tax invoices promptly and accurately. Moreover, e-Tax Invoice is also helping to reduce the cost significantly in terms of reducing the use of paper and space used for data collection, and helping entrepreneur to make a VAT report of input and output taxes automatically".

Ms. Prowmatr Hantra, Principal Advisor on Information and Communication Technology, the Revenue Department further that "The ones eligible to issue electronic tax invoices and receipts must be registered entrepreneurs who are company limited or public company limited with a paid-up capital of more than 10 million baht or any government agencies. They also have to engage all the accounting system necessary to accommodate the e-Tax Invoices and receipts. Additionally, they must have a stability and reliability on their business for examples, having a good tax history, no tax avoidance behavior, and no history of using fake invoices.
