Mr. Kittirat Na Ranong, Deputy Prime Minister and the Finance Minister, led the opening ceremony for the 42nd meeting of The Study Group on Asian Tax Administration and Research (SGATAR). The meeting focuses on the comprehensive preparation for tax authorities on administering tax evasion in international transactions. Malaysia and South Korea will co-operate in exchanging officials each year in order to improve and develop tax administration. Further, Asia Development Bank agrees to help draft international laws in accordance with the regulations set out by the Organisation for Economic and Co-operation and Development, while OECD will support by offering professionals in this study area in order for the tax authority to administer international transactions in the upcoming AEC.
