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Subject	:	Contacting for tax transaction, no certificate of registration needed

Digitalizing its working procedure to become more user-centric, the Revenue Department has abolished the hard copy requirement of certificate of registration for any tax transaction. Instead, the information will be exchanged via secure internet system in order to reduce the burden of entrepreneurs and boost efficiency, following the government's Thailand 4.0 policy.

Mrs. Sommai Siriudomset, Principal Advisor on Strategic Tax Administration (Energy Industry) as Spokesperson of the Revenue Department, stated that "In order to facilitate entrepreneurs, the Revenue Department decided to abolish the use of hard copy of certificate of registration, memorandum of association and list of shareholders' names. Instead, the aforementioned documents will be electronically linked with Department of Business Development (DBD) system."

Mrs. Sommai also made a final remark that "The abolition of using hard copy of the above mentioned documents under the No Copy policy is another milestone for the Revenue Department towards digital transformation (RD 4.0). Moreover, this transformation will boost efficiency and reduce burden of entrepreneurs."
